


Bill Blake

Bill Blake is campaign executive for counter unmanned aerial systems at Raytheon. Previously he was Chief Executive of Raytheon Saudi Arabia in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. Dr. Nicholas P. Jones is The Pennsylvania State University's Executive Vice President and Provost.

As Executive Vice President, Dr. Jones serves as the chief executive officer in the President's absence, and he is centrally involved in most University operations. As Provost, Dr. Jones is the University's chief academic officer, responsible for the administration of all of Penn State's educational and research programs. He is charged with enabling and driving the success of about 17,000 faculty and nearly 100,000 students at Penn State's 25 campuses, including 24 throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the online World Campus. He also serves as the University's chief budget officer.

Dr. Jones came to Penn State in July of 2013 from Johns Hopkins University, where he served as the Benjamin T. Rome Dean of the Whiting School of Engineering and previously as Professor and Chairman of Civil Engineering. He also served for two years as Professor and Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He holds an M.S. and Ph.D. in Civil Engineering from the California Institute of Technology and previously earned his undergraduate degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Auckland in New Zealand.



Ellen Kuang

Dr. Ellen Kuang is deputy general manager of Harvest Wealth Management, based in Beijing, China. Before joining Harvest Wealth, Dr. Kuang served as a deputy division director of accounting supervision department at the China Securities Regulatory Commission from 2009 to 2012. She also worked at Citadel Investment Group in Chicago and Deloitte in DC from 2003 to 2008. Dr. Kuang holds a B.A. from Tsinghua University, M.S. in business administration and a Ph.D. in educational leadership from the Pennsylvania State University.



Bill Lane

Starting one week after graduating from Penn State, Bill Lane spent forty years at Caterpillar where he became Director of Global Government and Corporate Affairs. With responsibility for the company's advocacy in support of competitiveness, economic growth, and specially trade liberalization, he was center stage during many of the most contentious trade debates of the past three decades.

Most recently Bill was executive director of Trade for America, a coalition supporting the modernization of NAFTA and KORUS. He is a Wall Street Journal contributor and chairman emeritus of the U.S. Global Leadership Coalition, which supports U.S. funding for diplomacy and development.

For over a decade Bill was regularly named one of Washington's top corporate lobbyists by The Hill newspaper. In 2016, he was awarded the Washington International Trade Association's Lighthouse Award.

Bill received the Penn State Alumni Fellow Award in 2011 and currently chairs the Penn State Global Advisory Council. Bill is a frequent speaker and volunteer for university events and initiatives. He is a member of the Smeal College of Business Hammond Society.



Srikanth Paruchuri

Dr. Paruchuri is a professor of innovation and entrepreneurship in the Smeal College of Business at the Pennsylvania State University, and a Smeal Executive Education Programs Fellow. Prior to joining Penn State, he was an associate professor at the University of Florida, Gainesville.
